

OUICK FACTS 2007-2008

Wake Tech served 18,899 students in curriculum and 43,266 in continuing education courses: 62,165 total.

- 23% of enrolled students already have a BA degree or higher
- 3,701 (unduplicated) students were awarded some form of financial aid assistance - Total: \$13,888,381; \$3,753 average per student
- 1,483 students graduated from Wake Tech with an associate degree, diploma, or certificate. Since 1963 over 31,000 individuals have earned an associate degree, diploma, or certificate through Wake Tech.
- In 2007-2008 Wake Tech awarded 686 GEDs and Adult High School diplomas. Since 1963 over 13,000 individuals have earned their GED through Wake Tech and over 2,000 individuals have earned their Adult High School diploma.
- 99% of graduates were employed within one year
- 97% employer satisfaction with Customized Training from 1,805 respondents
- In 2007-2008 Wake Tech provided basic skills courses to 8,003 individuals; 4,374 were English as a Second Language (ESL) students
- In 2007-2008 Wake Tech offered over 2,200 classes in the following areas in Wake County:
