

QUICK FACTS 2008-2009

Wake Tech served 21,193 students in curriculum and 44,646 in continuing education courses: 65,839 total.

- 22% of enrolled students already have a BA degree or higher
- 4,177 students were awarded some form of financial aid assistance - Total: \$17,598,001; \$4,213 average per student
- 1,463 students graduated from Wake Tech with an associate degree, diploma, or certificate. Since 1963 over 32,000 individuals have earned an associate degree, diploma, or certificate through Wake Tech.
- In 2008-2009 Wake Tech awarded 747 GEDs and 87 Adult High School diplomas. Since 1963 over 14,000 individuals have earned their GED through Wake Tech and over 2,000 individuals have earned their Adult High School diploma.
- 99% of graduates were employed within one year
- 97% employer satisfaction with Customized Training from 1,916 respondents
- In 2008-2009 Wake Tech provided basic skills courses to 8,856 individuals; 4,427 were English as a Second Language (ESL) students
- In 2008-2009 Wake Tech offered over 2,700 classes in the following areas in Wake County:
