

## **QUICK FACTS 2011-2012**

Wake Tech served 26,248 students in curriculum and 40,428 in continuing education courses: 66,676 total.

- √ 14,630 enrolled students already have a BA degree or higher (22% of total student body)
- √ 10,828 students were awarded some form of financial aid assistance - Total: \$58,269,921; \$5,381 average per student
- ✓ 2,216 students graduated from Wake Tech with an associate degree, diploma, or certificate. Since 1963 over 37,000 individuals have earned an associate degree, diploma, or certificate through Wake Tech.
- ✓ In 2011-2012 Wake Tech awarded 744 GEDs and 49 Adult High School diplomas. Since 1963 over 15,500 individuals have earned their GED through Wake Tech and over 2,000 individuals have earned their Adult High School diploma.
- ✓ In 2011-2012 Wake Tech provided basic skills courses to 7.150 individuals.
- ✓ In 2011-2012 Wake Tech offered 11,773 class sections. Some examples are:

## **Student Performance**

- ✓ Wake Tech graduates (Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, & Associate in Applied Science) (2009-2010) had an overall average GPA of 3.02 after their first year (2010-2011) at a UNC System institution compared with UNC native juniors' overall average GPA of 2.88.
- ✓ 508 Wake Tech students (who earned at least 24 semester hours at Wake Tech in 2009-10) transferred to a UNC System institution in 2010-11. These students had a higher average GPA (2.88) compared with native UNC sophomores (2.76) after one year at a UNC institution.

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## 2011-2012 Grants Development Report

Each year, Wake Technical Community College submits grant proposals to federal, state, and other funding sources to support innovative initiatives college wide. During the 2011-12 fiscal year, Wake Tech received grants for 34 projects totaling \$3.6 million included the following Wake Tech initiatives:

- National Science Foundation to collaborate with North Carolina State University in creating internship tracks that will increase diversity in geosciences.
- North Carolina Community College System to expand training for nursing faculty members in the use of simulation manikins to enhance clinical education for student nurses.
- Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to create a strong platform of student success initiatives that will develop into a model pathway for student success.
