


Objectives

- Protect the health and safety of the college's faculty, staff, students, and visitors
- Advise employees, students, and visitors of protocols for social distancing
- Monitor conditions and immediately take steps to limit and mitigate safety risks



COVID Protocols

 Failure to wear a mask and maintain social distancing will result in removal from class or campus



Personal Hygiene

Know Your Ws guidance:

- 1. Wear a cloth face covering
- 2. Wait 6 feet apart. Avoid close contact
- 3. Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer
- 4. Avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands
- 5. Avoid physical contact between employees
- Clean, sanitize, and disinfect frequently touched services at least daily and shared objects between each use.

 - Positive Test with Symptoms
 - Negative Test With Symptoms

Communication

- Immediately report possible exposure or diagnosis to your instructor.
- Upon receiving a report, instructors will notify Human Resources at auhr@waketech.edu and their direct supervisor.
- Human Resources will communicate with executive leadership and maintain appropriate confidentiality while promptly notifying anyone who may be impacted so that they can self-monitor.
- Assist with contact tracing. This information will be tracked separately from personnel and student records, and names will remain confidential.
- College may close impacted classroom for up to 72 hours to allow for disinfection.
- Individuals may be asked to provide documentation from a healthcare provider that they are cleared to return to campus.
