"Assessment is the systematic collection, review and use of information and data about educational programs for the purpose of improving student learning and development."

(Palomba & Banta, 1999; Suskie, 2009)



"Assessment is any effort to gather, analyze, and interpret evidence, which describes institutional, divisional, or agency effectiveness."

(Upcraft and Schuh, 1996, p.18)



Assessment is a process of determining "what is".

Evaluation is **to judge** something with respect to its worth or significance



"Evaluation is any effort to is use assessment evidence to improve departmental, or divisional, or institutional effectiveness"

(Upcraft and Schuh, 1996, p.19)

Program Outcomes


The focus is on impact, not the process
