

QUICK FACTS 2016-2017

Wake Tech served 31,472 students in curriculum (CU); 42,448 in workforce continuing education (WCE); 246 students in a CheMOOC; 870 in College Reading & Writing MOOC. Increase over 2016-2017 in green; Decreases in red

- ü 14,987 (1%) enrolled students already have a BA degree or
- higher (20% of total student body) 9,626 (-7.7%) students were awarded a Federal Pell Grant ü Total: \$30,959,178 (-19.2%); \$3,216 (-12.4%) average per student
- ü 13,075 (0.7%) students were awarded some type of financial Loan assistance; Total: \$45,949,128 (-4.9%); \$3,514 (-5.7%) average per student
- ü 5,463 (86%) students graduated from Wake Tech with an associate degree, diploma, or certificate.
- ü Since Wake Tech began awarding degrees in 1963, over 55,942 (5.1%) individuals have earned an associate degree, diploma, or certificate through Wake Tech.
- ü In 2016-2017 Wake Tech awarded 476 (-21.2%) HSEs and 70 (-12.5%) Adult High School diplomas.
- ü Since Wake Tech began awarding degrees in 1963, over 23,900 (2.0%) individuals have earned their HSE through Wake Tech and over 2,860 (2.5%) individuals have earned their Adult High School diploma.
- In 2016-17 Wake Tech provided basic skills courses to 5,967 individuals. (-17.5%) ü
- In 2016-17 Wake Tech offered 6,867 CU; 6,187 WCE; ü 13,054 total class sections (-3%). Some examples are:

Student Performance

- ü 265 Wake Tech graduates (Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, Associate in Applied Science) (2014-2015) had an overall average GPA of 3.12 after their first year (2015at a UNC System institution compared with UNC 2016) native juniors' overall average GPA of 3.06
- 311 Wake Tech students (who earned at least 30 semester hours at Wake Tech in 2014-2015) transferred to a UNC ü System institution in 2015-2016. These students had an average GPA of (2.85) compared with native UNC sophomores (3.0) after one year at a UNC institution.

2016-2017 Grants Development Report

Each year, Wake Technical Community College submits grant proposals to federal, state, and other funding sources to support innovative initiatives college wide. During the 2016-17 fiscal year, Wake Tech received grants for 31 projects totaling \$10.99 million included the following Wake Tech initiatives:

- Wake Tech is among the Aspen Institute's Frontier Set, a group of 31 national colleges, universities, and organizations committed to significantly increasing student access and success and eliminating racial/ethnic and socio-economic disparities in college attainment.
- The National Science Foundation's Advanced Technological Education program funded Robotics Awake, an initiative of our Advanced Manufacturing program to collaborate with industry partners in developing curriculum for training technicians in the operation, utilization, and programming of light industrial robots.
- With funding from Accenture, Wake Tech is able to quickly train workers skilled in the operations of NC FAST, a program designed to improve the way the NC Department of Health and Human Services and county departments of social services do business.
- Support from Duke Energy will allow the college to increase the number of Electric Vehicle Charging Station (EVCS) ports at the Northern and Southern campus locations, continuing Wake Tech's aggressive efforts to provide alternative transportation options to decrease vehicle miles traveled and lower greenhouse gas emissions.
