

QUICK FACTS 2017-2018

Wake Tech served 29,936 students in for-credit education & training (CU); 40,708 in non-credit education & training (WCE); 5,987 students in an Algebra Massive Open Online Course (MOOC); 225 students in a Chemistry MOOC; 611 in College Reading & Writing MOOC.

- 14,485 of all enrolled CU & WCE students already have a BA degree or higher (20.5% of total student body)
- 9,089 students were awarded a Federal Pell Grant totaling: \$30,445,927;
 \$3,350 average per eligible student
- 6,396 students were awarded Federal Loan Assistance; totaling: \$37,709,986;
 \$5,896 average per eligible student
- 5,252 students graduated from Wake Tech with an associate degree, diploma, or certificate.
- In 2017-18 Wake Tech awarded 497 High School Equivalency (HSE) and 65 Adult High School diplomas.
- Since Wake Tech began awarding degrees in 1963, over 24,494 individuals have earned their HSE through Wake Tech and over 2,925 individuals have earned their Adult High School diploma.
- ✓ In 2017-18 Wake Tech provided basic skills courses to 5,812 individuals.
- ✓ In 2017-18 Wake Tech offered 6,800 CU; 6,170 WCE; 12,970 total class sections. Some examples are:

Transfer Student Performance

- The 349 Wake Tech graduates (who had earned an Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, or Associate in Applied Science) (2015-2016) had an overall average GPA of 3.01 after their first year (2016-2017) at a UNC System institution compared with the UNC native juniors' overall average GPA of 2.90
- ✓ The 344 Wake Tech students who had earned at least 30 semester hours at Wake Tech in 2015-2016 transferred before earning a Wake Tech credential to a UNC System institution in 2016-2017. These students had an average GPA of 2.66 compared with the native UNC sophomores 2.88 after one year at a UNC institution.

2017-2018 Grants Development Report

To foster innovation and address the unmet needs of the college, Sponsored Programs partners with leaders across the college to raise and manage funds in the form of grants and appropriations from federal, state, and local governments as well as foundations. Wake Tech was awarded more than \$8 million in grants and appropriations in 2017-18 to support 22 projects.

- ✓ For-Credit Education & Training: The Career and College Ready Graduate grant from the NCCCS will help prepare colleges to address the academic preparation of high school seniors before they begin college by providing professional development to community college personnel across the state. - Enrollment & Student Services: The Pathways Professional Experience grant from the PNC Foundation immerses minority male students in early career exploration and development experiences with community partners to learn about career pathways and improve their professional skills. - ✓ Physical Facilities: The Green Trek project works with community
 partners to provide students, faculty, and staff with free bus passes
 and information on ride sharing to decrease vehicle miles traveled
