Traffic Rules and Regulations

In order for a student to park on Southern Wake (Main) Campus, Northern Wake Campus or the Perry Health Sciences Campus, each vehicle must be registered and display a current, official registration decal. Each faculty and staff vehicle parked on any Wake Tech campus or center must be registered and display a College-issued registration decal.

The decal is to be affixed either to the left rear bumper or inside the rear window on the driver's side (in which case it must be visible from outside the vehicle).

Registration of student vehicles must be conducted each year as part of the student registration process. Each vehicle intended to be parked on campus must be registered separately and have its own decal. [Note: the student vehicle registration and parking decal requirement applies only to students who park on Southern Wake Campus, Northern Wake Campus or the Perry Health Sciences Campus.]

Vehicle registration rules apply at all times. Individuals who violate parking and registration rules will be subject to fines and possible additional penalties as specified in the ordinance entitled "Wake Technical Community College Traffic Rules and Regulations."

Visitors to Southern Wake Campus must display a temporary parking pass on the driver's side dashboard. A temporary pass can be obtained at the reception desk in Building M, Montague Hall.

The following rules remain in force for every motor vehicle at a Wake Tech campus, center and site.

- No vehicle shall be driven in a careless or reckless manner or in a direction opposite to that indicated by signs or markings on roadways that are designated as one-way streets.
- The speed limit is 20 miles per hour.
- Vehicles in non-parallel parking spaces shall be parked with the front end of the vehicle at the angle to the curb indicated by markings or signs, and no vehicle shall be parked in such a manner as to occupy more than one space. All vehicles must park in the direction of the flow of the traffic pattern.
- No faculty, staff, or student may use parking spaces reserved for specific persons or functions (i.e., visitors, President, institutional vehicles, etc.).

Each vehicle must be parked in a legitimate parking space. Parking in the following places is prohibited:

- on a sidewalk or walkway;
- along the main driveway entering a Wake Tech campus or center;
- in driving lanes of parking areas;
- in loading or unloading areas;
- in fire lanes;
- on grass or landscaped areas; and
- in approaches or other portions of parking areas that are not clearly marked for parking.

Any vehicle that is stopped or parked may be moved off-site at the owner's expense at the direction of the Chief of Campus Police when it is determined that:

- it is illegally parked in a handicapped space (which carries a **\$250** penalty);
- it is parked in a reserved parking space without prior authorization;
- it is parked in a location not designed for parking;
- the parking privileges for the vehicle have been previous revoked; or
- it has been abandoned.

EACH OF THE FOLLOWING VIOLATION CATEGORIES CARRIES A FINE OF \$25.00

Registration Violations

- Failure to register vehicle
- Failure to display current parking decal

Parking Violations

- Parking in unauthorized space
- Parking in a non-parking space
- Parking in a manner creating a hazard
- Vehicle facing in wrong direction
- Vehicle parked improperly in parking space

Moving Violations

- Driving in a hazardous manner
- Failure to heed a stop sign
- Failure to heed a yield sign
- Driving the wrong way in one-way drive lanes

Appeals from traffic citations must be made in writing within 7 days to the Appeals Review Board through the Office of the Executive Vice President. Appeals submitted after the 7-day period will not be considered. Appeal forms may be obtained at the reception desk in Building M, Montague Hall, on Southern Wake Campus or at the dean's office in Building HS2 at the Perry Health Sciences Campus.

Fines must be paid within 14 days of issuance of a citation. Failure to pay fines within that period may result in the revocation of campus parking privileges. Furthermore, individuals who acquire 3 or more violation citations during a semester may have their parking privileges revoked.

Until fines are paid or otherwise resolved, a student may not participate in graduation ceremonies, receive graduation-related documentation, obtain transcripts, or register for class.
