Dear Dr. Boone:

Thank you for your letter of June 21, 2017, seeking approval to close the Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree program in Simulation and Game Development delivered to Nash Community College as part of an instructional service agreement, effective summer 2017.

The service agreement was terminated because Nash Community College has now developed its own A.A.S. degree program in Simulation and Game Development and, therefore, no longer needs instructional support from Wake Tech Community College. Wake Tech will continue offering the program to its own students.

A teach-out plan was included. It noted that students enrolled in the program at Nash Community College as part of the instructional agreement may continue pursuing the A.A.S. degree at either institution without incurring any additional expenses or hardship. Faculty who taught courses at both institutions as part of the service agreement will remain employed at Wake Tech and will not be impacted by its termination.

The Commission approves the closure of the A.A.S. in Simulation and Game Development delivered to Nash Community College as part of an instructional service agreement and requests no additional information.
